First week of term

Your first day of attendance will be **Monday 12 September 2016.** Please report to **Falmouth Campus Reception** at **10am**. You will be directed to your first meeting in the Studio in Kathmor House where you will meet staff, student mentors and your first year colleagues.

Your first week at Falmouth will be an induction and orientation week. You will also be given course outlines and timetables. There will be important inductions for both the Architecture course and the wider university, in addition to a number of social activities.

To keep up to date, we recommend that you export the feed to your chosen device (mobile, tablet, laptop or desktop). An induction will be offered on the use of MyTimetable during freshers' week. Students will have access to their individual student timetables, where appropriate, once they have completed their online enrolment and IT induction.

Pre-course preparation Materials and equipment list and costs

Essential

You will need the following items for the start of the course:

- A5 and A3 sketchbooks RRP £5-£10.
- Drawing tools 0.3mm, 0.5mm, 0.9mm auto-pencils, and a variety of pens, a putty rubber RRP £7.
- Laptop It doesn't matter which platform (Apple or Windows, though a Mac can run Windows software through Boot Camp). It should have 16GB RAM, a large 250GB plus

hard drive and be light enough for you to carry. Buy as fast a processor as you can afford.

- A backup external hard drive.
- Outdoor clothing and footwear for field trips and visits (also for general life, and this is Cornwall we do have fantastic sunshine, but it can rain!)
- A 5m or 8m tape measure RRP £8.
- Masking tape of varying widths RRP £5.
- A decent waterproof bag for lumping this kit around (did I say it rains?)
- Swann Morton Retractable Safety Scalpel and 10a or 11a blades (nothing else does the job) RRP £6.
- Plasters RRP £2.
- 300mm Metal safety ruler ('W' section) RRP £10.
- 300mm Adjustable set square RRP £10.
- Architectural Scale Rule (1:1,1:5,1:10,1:20,1:50,1:100,1:200...) RRP £20.

A sensible budget for the above items is approximately £1400 including the laptop and external drive.

Materials and equipment list and costs

Essential

There will be some on-going expenses as the course progresses, particularly paper and other consumable materials, so budget for some expenditure each week. I would allow £150 to purchase additional materials and equipment if possible, over the year.

There will also be costs throughout the course in purchasing material for making models. It would be sensible to allow approx. £300 per academic year for these types of materials.
