First week of term

Your first day of attendance will be **Monday 12 September 2016**. Please join us for your introductory meeting outside the main **Reception**, **Penryn Campus** at **9.30am** where a member of the team will be there to meet you.

Your first week at Falmouth will be an induction and orientation week. There will be important inductions for both the course and the wider university, in addition to a number of social activities. You will also be given course outlines and instructions on how to access your timetable.

To keep up to date, we recommend that you export the feed to your chosen device (mobile, tablet, laptop or desktop). An induction will be offered on the use of MyTimetable during freshers' week. Students will have access to their individual student timetables, where appropriate, once they have completed their online enrolment and IT induction.

Pre-course preparation Materials and equipment list

Essential

At the start of term you will be introduced to your first project, so it is essential that you bring your own camera equipment. You will require:

- DSLR camera with standard 50mm prime lens, capable of shooting in RAW format with settings allowing for fully manual operation (Canon & Nikon are supported by our photographic stores) – approximate minimum cost £600.
- A 4Gb (minimum) good quality high speed memory card is recommended for the above together with a USB card reader approximate minimum cost £25.

- Sekonic Flashmate L-308S light meter (or similar) approximate minimum cost £120.
- USB flash memory stick (minimum 4Gb recommended) approximate minimum cost £10.
- USB portable external hard drive (minimum 250Gb recommended) approximate minimum cost £60.
- Blower brush or sensor cleaning kit and lens cloth approximate minimum cost £10.
- Print Box/Portfolio case approximate minimum cost £15.

During your course

Materials and equipment list

Essential

You will have a number of recurring annual costs for materials, as indicated below:

- Workbooks approximately £120 (based on 1 x A3 hardback workbook per project).
- General printing costs approximately £360 (based on colour page printing at 26p per sheet for workbooks, reports and essays).
- Image printing costs between £180 £400.

Optional

You may wish to invest in a camera bag for an approximate minimum cost of £40.

Reading list

Optional

You will be given a reading list for the duration of the course once you have enrolled with us. All the books listed are not essential to the course, and can be found for free in the library. You may wish to purchase these books for yourself. As an indication, you could expect to pay between £300 and £450 on these books.

Study trips and costs

Essential

There will be a study trip to London during London Fashion Week that all students must attend. The dates will be Thursday 16 to Tuesday 21 February 2016. Optional

During the first week you will have the option to participate in a number of activities which may include a study trip to St Ives and a surfing lesson at a possible cost of around £30 per student, which includes hire of boards and wetsuits. Places will be limited but we will give you all the information you need at the start of term.

You may have the chance to undertake various optional study visits and placements for the course duration. You should expect to pay no more than £1,750 for these trips.

- This includes approximately £400 for travel costs for visits to industry professionals in London.
- There will be additional costs for attending exhibitions. This will vary depending upon the travel and accommodation you choose, alongside the presentation format you decide upon for your work.
