

BURSARY APPLICATION FORM: Local Developing Jazz Artist

Falmouth-Yamaha Jazz Summer School aims to support developing jazz artists who are resident in Cornwall and who would value from a concentrated programme of jazz study and playing, but who might otherwise find it difficult to fully cover the cost of attending the course. Partial bursaries are available for musicians who show a keen interest and commitment towards honing and perfecting their skills and who are actively involved in some form of solo or ensemble rehearsal and performance work.

This partial bursary covers £235 of the course-only fee. Recipients will be required to contribute £175. The bursary does not cover accommodation which is £210 for seven nights. Deadline for applications is **1 July 2016** with notification of a place given by **11 July 2016**.
