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

WHAT HAS FALMOUTH UNIVERSITY INVESTED IN

BUILDINGS & FACILITIES

This is the total spent on capital investment. Historically this has been largely funded by EU and other grants but will need to be largely self-funded or financed by bank loans in the future.

This expenditure is necessary to keep facilities up to date and has also provided new buildings such as The Exchange, AIR and The School of Communication Design.
