The following pages set out how Falmouth University generates revenues and how that money is spent.




Falmouth University is a Higher Education Corporation and has charitable status. All surpluses generated are reinvested for the purposes of teaching and research





TOTAL INCOME



UNDERGRADUATE FEES

The above is based on the standard undergraduate fee for the year of £9,000.

Actual costs vary by course but the University has targets such that all students get an equal service for the same fee. Cross subsidisation between courses is minimal and all Academic Departments have to be financially convergent over the life of the **Strategic Plan.**



Our Income & Expenditure WHAT HAS FALMOUTH UNIVERSITY INVESTED IN

BUILDINGS & FACILITIES

This is the total spent on capital investment. Historically this has been largely funded by EU and other grants but will need to be largely self-funded or financed by bank loans. This expenditure is necessary to keep facilities up to date and has also provided new buildings including the following recent major investments:

- Reception and shop, Penryn Campus (15/16)
- Fox 3 Courtyard, Falmouth Campus (15/16)
- School of Communication Design, Falmouth Campus (13/14)
- The Exchange, Penryn Campus (12/13)
- Belmont House, Falmouth Campus (12/13)
- AIR Building, Penryn Campus (11/12)






Income from our joint venture, FX Plus, is not included in the financial statements. The above graph shows how income is generated which in turn achieved a surplus in the year of £531,000 which was shared equally with the University of Exeter.


FX Plus is a limited company with charitable status and spends any surplus on the students and staff of the two institutions.
