First week of term

You'll begin your course on Monday 18 September 2017. Please report to your introductory meeting in Studio A, AMATA, Performance Centre, Penryn Campus at 11am. There will be a Welcome Talk from Terrie Fender, Director of the Academy of Music & Theatre Arts (AMATA), for all Dance, Acting and Theatre students.

This is the week when you'll meet your course mates, course tutors and the university staff. There will be important inductions for both the course and the wider university, in addition to a number of social activities. You will also be given course outlines and timetables.

Individual tickets for professional performances can cost up to £20, but Falmouth University students can purchase season tickets and save up to 70% on the face value of tickets across the AMATA Public Programme, as well as avoiding booking fees. There are two options for purchasing AMATA Student Season tickets:

A one-year student season ticket contains six tickets for performances and events at AMATA in 2017/18 and costs £50. A three-year student season ticket contains 18 tickets (six tickets per year for the 2017/18, 2018/19 and 2019/20 programmes) and costs £100. Both Season Ticket deals include an AMATA t-shirt.

We strongly encourage students to purchase season tickets as they provide a highly subsidised, cost-effective way of attending performances and events that have been programmed to enhance and support your studies at AMATA. Season tickets are available now to book at amata.org.uk/seasontickets
