These are not essential to your studies but you may find them helpful.

Materials and equipment list and costs

Essential

You will need the following items for the start of the course:

a) a range of materials for life and observational drawing, including:

- A4 sketchbook.
- A2 sketchbook.
- pocket-sized sketchbook.
- a good range of drawing pencils from H to 6B and a sharpener.

The price of materials may vary, but you can expect to spend approximately £30 on these.

b) other art materials:

- coloured pencils.
- pastels.
- inks or paints.
- paint brushes.
- dip pens.
- rubber.
- Sellotape.
- masking tape.
- Blutack.
- glue stick.
- scissors.
- ruler.

The price of materials may vary, but you can expect to spend approximately £70 on these.

c) additional equipment:

- a graphics tablet – such as a Wacom Intuos Draw or Art.
- hole punch.
- notebook for lectures/seminars.
- pen.
- USB memory sticks (min 32 GB).
- external hard drive (min 1TB) for backing up your own work.
- craft knife.

- permanent marker.
- folders or portfolio for animation drawing/design work.
- folders to keep handouts and filed seminar notes.
- good quality headphones – you will need these for working in the studio and for your sound based projects.

The price of materials may vary, but you can expect to spend approximately £200 on these.

During your course

Materials and equipment list and costs

Essential

All other specialist equipment and materials will be supplied. We do not expect students to have their own computer equipment but if you were thinking of purchasing a suitable machine, and need advice, then please wait until you arrive on the course. Your choice of direction with Animation & Visual Effects could dictate which sort of machine or spec you require.

Optional

We endeavour to provide everything that you will need to make your animation or visual effects work, however, you might still need to purchase some items during your studies. This might include some materials for making puppets or sets in stopmotion. (We do have armature wire and ball and socket armatures and a range of other materials for you to use.) All curriculum specific software is available in the studios but you may decide to purchase your own licences for specific programs like TV Paint or the Adobe Suite for working off-campus.

The price of these versions of software may vary, but you can expect to spend approximately £117 for TV Paint and approximately £16 for the full Adobe suite.

Study trips and costs

Optional

We are planning a trip to the Manchester Animation Festival that takes place in November. We have found that the Animation Festival visits are enormously useful to students of both animation and visual effects. You will have access to animation screenings, workshops and visiting speakers. It is also a great opportunity to bond with fellow animators and students. A trip at the end of the year to the Annecy International Animation Festival in France is also planned.

Both of these trips are optional and it's not necessary to attend them in order for you to progress through your studies. However, we would encourage you to take advantage of one of them.

The Manchester Festival will cost you approximately £260 for the pass, accommodation and travel. Please allow extra for refreshments. Annecy will cost you approximately £740 for the pass, accommodation and travel, though, please be aware that flight costs are likely to change and please allow extra for refreshments.

We will be in touch nearer to the time of the visits themselves with details of the exact cost, so look out for that once you're here with us.

Enrolment and Student Terms & Conditions

You will receive an email two weeks prior to the start of term with details of how to enrol online. All students must enrol online before the first day of term in order to be officially registered as a student of Falmouth University. If you plan to receive an undergraduate student loan, you must enrol to have your money released to you.
