First week of term

Your first day of attendance will be **Monday 18 September 2017**. Please report to your introductory meeting at **Studio A, AMATA**, **Performance Centre**, **Penryn Campus** at **11am**. There will be a Welcome Talk from Terrie Fender, Director of the Academy of Music & Theatre Arts (AMATA), for all Dance and Theatre students.

Your first week at Falmouth will be an induction and orientation week. There will be important inductions for both the course and the wider university, in addition to a number of social activities. You will also be given course outlines and timetables.

You will be given a schedule for the rest of the Induction week, and there will also be an opportunity later in the day to meet with the Dance team and your fellow students. The Induction week will give you an overview of your studies for the coming year, the schedule of classes and other information that you will need to support your work. Most importantly, it will be your first real opportunity to meet everyone and take part in a dance workshop. You will also be able to explore our exciting performance and library facilities on Penryn Campus and get to know the surrounding area.

Highlights of the forthcoming AMATA 2017/2018 programme will include Budapest Cafe Orchestra, Tavaziva Dance, and Omar Sosa and Seckou Keita. Our full Autumn Season programme will be available at http://amata.org.uk/ from 18 August.

Individual tickets for professional performances can cost up to £20, but Falmouth University students can purchase season tickets and save up to 70% on the face value of tickets across the AMATA Public Programme, as well as avoiding booking fees. There are two options for purchasing AMATA Student Season tickets:

A one-year student season ticket contains six tickets for performances and events at AMATA in 2017/18 and costs £50. A three-year student season ticket contains 18 tickets (six tickets per year for the 2017/18, 2018/19 and 2019/20 programmes) and costs £100. Both Season Ticket deals include an AMATA t-shirt.

We strongly encourage students to purchase season tickets as they provide a highly subsidised, cost-effective way of attending performances and events that have been programmed to
