First week of term

Your first official day of attendance will be **Monday 18 September 2017**. Please report to the **Old Chapel Lecture Theatre**, **Penryn Campus** at **9am** for a welcome talk

This is the week when you'll meet your course mates, course tutors and the university staff. There will be important inductions for both the course and the wider university, in addition to a number of social activities. You will also be given course outlines and timetables.

There will be a mandatory on-line preparation course prior to starting your studies during August. It is important that you check your emails during this time. The email will include a link to the on-line preparation course to enable you to participate in a number of tasks in order to prepare you for undergraduate study on the BA Photography programme.

This is the link to MyTimetable, your online academic calendar which shows all scheduled learning activities and your course timetable. It will be available from 14 September 2017, however, timetables can be subject to change. To keep up to date, we recommend that you export the feed to your chosen device (mobile, tablet, laptop or desktop). An induction will be offered on the use of MyTimetable during Freshers 2017. Students have access to their individual student timetables, once they have completed their online enrolment and IT induction.

Pre-course preparation

For the start of term, we expect all students to have a 35mm SLR Camera capable of RAW shooting and fully manual operation. We also expect students to have an analogue film SLR camera (Canon and Nikon are supported by our stores).

We also enclose details about the equipment and books that you should have when you start the course.

During your second academic week at Falmouth, from 2 – 6 October, the year group will be undertaking a pinhole camera project. Please bring an empty, washed out aluminium beer/Coke-type can, 440 or 500ml. Aluminium is non-magnetic on a fridge door. It is not necessary for you to make the camera in advance, as you will be given guidance during the project.

Materials and equipment list and costs Essential

All students must have the following equipment for the start of term. The costs will be approximately $\pm 600 - \pm 1000$.

- Digital SLR Camera with standard or mid-range zoom lens capable of **RAW shooting** and fully manual operation (Canon & Nikon are supported by our stores).
- Manual screw-in type cable release.
- CF and SD cards, minimum 4Gb recommended.
- USB Card reader for the above.
- USB flash memory stick, minimum 8Gb recommended.
- USB Hard Drive, minimum 250Gb recommended.
- Ring binder Negative filing system binder (loose leaf type).
- Spotting brush No.1 sable.
- Lens cloth.
- Air-blower for cleaning dust off equipment & negatives.
- Loupe (magnifier, Kaiser 8 or similar).

You will also need a print box to submit your work in for your assessments. This can be purchased from www.silverprint.co.uk. Code number 41751, Print Box 9.5" x12". This is the cheapest price we have found online and the box costs £11.95 from this supplier. However, please do shop around to find the best prices.

As a medium, photography is constantly developing. These figures are intended as a guide of anticipated expenditure on the course for 2017/2018.

During your course

Materials and equipment list and costs

Essential

Students need to budget for material costs for films and printing papers, the actual costs will depend on the amount of work you do and on the decisions you make in terms of processes, presentation, print size and so on. A budget of £200-£400 should cover basic film stock, printing and processing costs for each year of the course.

Optional

You may need to purchase other items but this will become clear as you progress through the course. These items can be obtained from the Photography Stores once you arrive. It is also

possible to buy many items of good quality second-hand photographic equipment; investigate this before buying new. Costs will be approximately £200-£400.

- Your camera User Manual.
- Lens hood and UV/Skylight filter for each of your lenses.
- Camera equipment holdall large enough for extra items you may wish to use/purchase during the course.
- Sturdy tripod.
- A film camera is useful to have but not essential.
- 120 and 35mm negative filing pages for above binder.
- Processing accessories thermometer, funnel, measuring cylinder and so on.
- Black focusing cloth (or piece of black cotton cloth 1 metre square).
- Lens cleaning cloth.
- Black print spotting medium (not dye) or tube of black water colour or gouache.
- Academic year diary.
- In addition, there will also be a number of stationery items that you will need to purchase during the course such as notepads, A4 binders, Stanley knife and so on.

Study trips and costs

Essential

There will be a number of educational trips during the course, which include course study visits, individual research trips and placements. These experiences are an integral part of your studies and you are expected to attend. We estimate this to be about £200 in total per year although this may vary, depending on the visits or placements arranged.

Optional

There is a trip to Krakow Photomonth festival in Poland scheduled for June 2018. The cost of the trip will be approximately £450.

We will also be arranging a study trip to New York in November 2019 and the cost of the trip will be approximately £955.

When you arrive on the 18 September please supply any medical, dietary requirements and emergency contact details.

Enrolment and Student Terms & Conditions

You'll get an email two weeks before the start of term telling you how to enrol online. You'll need to enrol before the first day of term to officially register as a student of Falmouth University and receive an undergraduate student loan.
