Supporting You



Student Services

Student Services can help you through your time at university with a range of specialist services and information.

We're here for all students and it doesn't matter how big or small your concerns – from money matters to mental health, housing or accessibility – we can help you find the answers and give you the support you need throughout your university life.

The Compass

If you don't know which service you need, a good starting point is The Compass helpdesk.

It's the first port of call for any Student Service enquiries about any aspect of student life. Our team can answer any questions or signpost you to the relevant department for any further help you might need.

Living Support

The Living Support team provide a personal, focussed service offering in-depth assessment, advising, referring and liaising on a wide range of student life issues to ensure that you receive effective practical advice and support, as well as understand your options.

Accessibility & Inclusive Learning

Accessibility & Inclusive Learning provides advice, support and assistance for students with disabilities and long-term health conditions, and with specific learning differences (SpLDs) including dyslexia and dyspraxia.

Dyslexia Skills Tutors help develop students' study skills and make the most of their learning strengths.

Wellbeing Services

Wellbeing Services provides self-help resources, counselling and advice for students who experience anxiety, stress and other mental health issues. They offer short-term solution- focused counselling. Your counsellor will respect your confidentiality, and will not give advice or judge you, but will work alongside you to find your way forward.

Wellbeing Practitioners help students to explore issues and concerns in a safe environment, and can support referral to external services such as the NHS.

Chaplaincy

The Multifaith Chaplaincy provides pastoral and spiritual care and conversation for students and staff of all faiths and none. Chaplains assist with meeting religious needs and can offer links to faith communities in Cornwall. The Chaplaincy also provides spaces on campus for prayer, meditation and quiet.

During Welcome Week, they will run on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. In the second week, tours will be available every day from Monday to Friday. All tours will start at the Library helpdesks and will run every 30 minutes between 11am and 1.30pm with an evening tour at the Penryn Campus Library at 6pm. Tours will take approximately 15 minutes.



Living in the Community



Being a Good Neighbour

If you're moving from University accommodation into the community for the first time, this can be an exciting time. Renting a house or flat with friends will be a big part of your university life. However, it comes with new responsibilities and new neighbours that you should be considerate of.

Moving in

There are some simple steps you should take when you first move into your privately rented accommodation:

1. Say hello!

Meet your new neighbours. Being on good terms with the people living next door can be really helpful – you can find out a bit about them and how they live their lives, and it will be easier for you to appreciate any concerns they may have. In turn, they might be more tolerant of any disturbance and can keep an eye on your property while you're away.

2. Do the accommodation admin

- Check the inventory that the landlord should have provided
- Take date stamped photos of each room, so you have a record of the condition of the property
- Read the utility meters
- Take a look at the gas certificate

3. Get familiar with the bin collections

A regular source of friction among students and the community is rubbish. Seagulls can be a particular nuisance!

- Use a bird/animal proof container such as a dustbin with secure lid or obtain a free seagull proof sack from the Town's One Stop Shop in Church Street.
- Use the proper bags/boxes for your recycling, which can be obtained free of charge at cornwall.gov.uk/recycling.
- Put your rubbish out for collection no earlier than dusk on the day before collection and remove your bins and boxes from the street once they've been emptied. Collections are on Tuesdays in Falmouth and Penryn.
- Don't put garden waste, bulky items, electrical equipment, chemicals or batteries or clinical waste such as needles or medicines out with your household waste.

4. Be aware of noise

- Give your neighbours plenty of notice if you are planning a house party and give them your contact details, in case there is a problem (if your neighbour has your number, they are more likely to call you than the police). Never advertise your party on Facebook.
- Tell your friends to be quiet when they leave your house in the evenings

- Minimise vibrations by moving TVs and speakers away from the walls and lowering the bass
- Close your windows and doors to stop sound travelling

5. Park considerately

You should not bring a car to university unless it is essential. If you must have a car at Falmouth, you are responsible for complying with local parking legislation including obtaining a Resident Parking Permit, if necessary.

Moving out

It might seem a long way away, but the year will fly by and it may soon be time to pack up again. Here are some tips on what to do when you move out.

1. Change your address

Do it 2-3 weeks before you move so you don't miss out on any essential post.

2. Cancel the utilities

Let your utility providers know you're leaving, or they'll keep charging you. Try to call them as soon as you know your moving out date and take meter readings on the day you leave.

3. Check the photos

Take a look at the pictures you took when you moved in to ensure everything's still in order. This includes going through the house inventory.

4. Have some good clean fun

Book a day with all your housemates to clean up before you move.

5. Speak to the landlord

Set up an inspection date to inspect the house together while you and your housemates are all still around.

6. If there are any problems...

...contact Student Services or the FXU advice team for help.



Staying Safe

Falmouth and Penryn are vibrant, diverse and safe places to live, study and work. But here are some things you can do to make sure you stay safe and well and some places you can turn to, if you need help and support.

Home security:

- Lock your doors and windows when you go out
- Keep valuables out of sight, security mark them and think about registering them so they can be identified if recovered by the police
- If you have a bike, get a good bike lock and make sure you always lock it to something secure

Personal safety:

- **Watch how much you drink**
Sometimes you can do risky things when you're drunk and you're more likely to lose your belongings. Make sure you eat before you drink, drink plenty of water and keep track of what and how much you're drinking.

Never leave your drink unattended or accept a drink from a stranger.

- **Look out for your friends**
Keep an eye on the people you're with, speak up if you think they might be drinking too much and don't let them wander off on their own.

- **Getting home**

Make sure your mobile is charged and able to make calls when you go out, try to leave a pub or club with friends, keep hold of some money for a taxi, pre-book a licensed cab or know the locations of official taxi ranks.

If you have to walk home alone, try to stick to well-lit areas.

Risk of suicide:

If you don't feel you can keep yourself safe or are worried someone else, seek immediate help:

- Go, or take the other person, to any hospital A&E department
- Call 999 and ask for an ambulance if you can't get to A&E

If you need some support right now, but don't want to go to A&E, here are some other options:

- Contact the Samaritans for free on 116 123, they're open 24 hours and are there to listen
- Contact your GP for an emergency appointment
- Call NHS 111
- Contact Student Services (who will be able to provide advice Monday to Friday 9-5).

A reminder about sexual consent:

It is an offence for a person to intentionally touch another person sexually without reasonable belief that they consented. Touching covers all physical contact, whether with a part of the body or anything else, or through clothing.

Consenting to one form of sexual activity does not mean implied consent to any other e.g., kissing doesn't mean you've agreed to anything else and consenting on one occasion does not imply consent at another. Consent can be withdrawn at any point and at any time and consent cannot be given if a person is drunk or high on drugs.

Essential Paperwork



Student Registration

Registering at Falmouth University means officially enrolling on your course, confirming your personal details, and agreeing to abide by the University regulations and policies.

You need to register every year.

Online Registration

In order to be officially registered as a student at Falmouth University, you must complete the online registration and enrolment process. If you are an undergraduate student, enrolling online will release your student loan.

Student loans are released on the first day of term if you have received confirmation from Student Finance that your application has been processed and have signed and returned your declaration form to your Student Finance body.

How to register

An email will be sent to your University email address up to two weeks before the start of your studies, alerting you when enrolment is open and available.

It is very important that you complete the online enrolment within two weeks of returning to your studies. Failing to enrol will result in your IT and building access being suspended and your course registration may also be terminated.

You will need your University Username and Password in order to enrol online. If you have forgotten this information, contact the IT Service Desk by emailing itservices@fxplus.ac.uk

Tier 4 International Student Re-registration & Visa Verification

At the start of each Study Block students will be asked to present themselves for re-registration. Please be aware that if you fail to respond to these requests when asked, it is most likely that your student registration will be cancelled and the UKVI will be informed.

Proof of Registration

At the start of each year you may be required to provide external organisations with proof of your registration in the form of a letter or certificate; you can request or print these via your My Falmouth account.

Council Tax Certificate

All full-time students are entitled to exemption from having to pay Council Tax. Once the registration period has ended we will notify Cornwall Council of all students and their term-time addresses.

It is your responsibility to ensure that you are registered at the correct address with the Council Taxation Office and therefore you are advised to contact them at revenues@cornwall.gov.uk.

If you are asked to provide a Council Tax Exemption Certificate you can print one directly from your student portal at myfalmouth.falmouth.ac.uk.

If you are a part-time student you may also need a letter from your course team confirming your hours of attendance.

Proof of Enrolment

Throughout your time at Falmouth University you may be asked to provide proof of other information relating to your studies; you can request these through the automated service online.

Please ensure you include any specific information required when making your request.

- Request on My Falmouth account
- Collect from Student Administration

If you require a formal letter that is not accessible via your My Falmouth account, please email student.admin@falmouth.ac.uk.

Interim Statement of Results

If you require proof of your module results you can view these details online through your My Falmouth account.

Should you require a printed copy to present to another university or to support a study abroad application, you will need to email student.admin@falmouth.ac.uk.



Student Administration

Student Administration consists of a number of different teams who can help students on their journey from application to graduation.

Submission of Student Work

There are three main submission routes:

1. Physical submission to the Student Administration Offices at Penryn or Falmouth Campus
2. Studio Submission as advised by the course team
3. Online submission

The standard hand-in dates including the timed deadlines for your modules will be available via the MyFalmouth portal. Details regarding the type of submission and where to submit your work will also be published here.

It is your responsibility to check deadlines and ensure that you submit on time.

Online submissions can take some time to upload and IT /printing facilities can be subject to delays in periods of high demand so please factor this in to your planning.

Work submitted after the published cut off point will be deemed as late and subject to a cap of 40%.

You can hand-in or submit work up to 1 week in advance of the published deadline.

If you have an adjusted deadline or an approved extenuating circumstances claim, your new individual deadline will be communicated via your hand in dates on the My Falmouth portal.

For further guidance on what you need to do to successfully submit your work go to the Student Administration Sharepoint Assessment Pages.

Extenuating Circumstances

If you need to apply for an extension before an assessment deadline please look at the Extenuating Circumstances Policy at falmouth.ac.uk/studentregulations.

Appeals & Complaints

Withdrawals, Intermittence & Transfer

In the first instance, contact your Personal Tutor for advice. Following which, if you require advice and guidance you can email student.admin@falmouth.ac.uk.

The official forms can be downloaded from the Student Administration SharePoint pages.

Important: if you want to change course, intermit (suspend your studies) or withdraw from your course, you must complete the appropriate paperwork before you leave. Failure to complete the appropriate paperwork can have financial implications.

Doctor's registration

If you didn't do so last year, all students are advised to register with a local GP practice. Information about healthcare services in Falmouth and Penryn is available from Student Services. Meningitis and measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccinations

How do I get my university bursary?

Ensure you have sent your signed 'Declaration' to Student Finance. You would have been asked to do this at the end of your application to Student Finance.

If you're eligible for a bursary, it will be paid directly into the same bank account used by Student Finance.




