BURSARIES AVAILABLE

Falmouth-Yamaha Jazz Summer School has a limited number of full and partial bursaries available. All bursaries are course-only and do not cover the cost of accommodation which is £231 for seven nights.

The deadline for applications is Friday 16 June 2017. Applications will be reviewed by a panel of Falmouth University representatives and you will receive notification by **26 June 2017**. The panel's decision is final.

Under 18 means-tested and Young Person

Falmouth-Yamaha Jazz Summer School aims to support young players and singers who are in full-time education and who would value from a concentrated programme of jazz study, and who might find it difficult to fully cover the cost of attending. Bursaries are available for young talented students with playing experience in any style of jazz and improvised music who have a keen interest and commitment to further developing their jazz skills.

There are three types of bursary available:

Under 18 means-tested:

5 full bursaries available, covering £499 of the course-only fee.

15 partial bursaries, which cover £450 of the course-only fee, recipients are required to contribute £49.

Young person (under 21) not means tested:

5 partial bursaries available which cover £200 of the course-only fee. Recipients will be required to contribute £299.

Local and Developing Jazz Artist

A limited number of partial bursaries which covers £200 of the course-only fee. Recipients will be required to contribute £299.

We aim to support 5 developing jazz artists who are resident in Cornwall and who would value from a concentrated programme of jazz study and playing, but who might otherwise find it difficult to fully cover the cost of attending the course. Partial bursaries are available for musicians who show a keen interest and commitment towards honing and perfecting their skills and who are actively involved in some form of solo or ensemble rehearsal and performance work.
