All of the University's courses are changing during the second study block (term) of the 2020/21 academic year. As a result of the COVID-19 Social Distancing requirements, all courses will be delivered using a blended learning approach, combining physical access to our campus and facilities with increased use of our virtual learning environment and other digital tools (e.g. Lectures and seminars being delivered via Microsoft Teams). In addition all assessments have been adapted to allow them to be submitted online.

FIL103 BA(Hons) Film;	First year (level 4)	The module was previously delivered and assessed based on a 5/6 person crew project, with groups of students working together in defined production roles. Individuals were taught in skills pathways that were determined by these roles, with central course content delivered to all students in such a way as to mirror a 12-week film production schedule. With the likelihood that lockdown restrictions will be in place next study block, and the expectation that many students will face challenges bringing crew- based film projects to the screen (including illness, quarantine, shielding, transport, difficult access to facilities, restrictions on off-campus filming and on using non-student actors) the central premise of the module - and associated assessment brief - has been altered to add flexibility to the route that students will take to complete their projects, and to maintain relevance to their actual production practice. Pathways will instead be created around a mid-term choice of a film form to work within – silent, experimental, documentary, commercial or future – with students able to produce their films on an individual basis, with lecture and workshop delivery designed to upskill all students in a range of cinematic techniques and ideas. Crew working will still be encouraged where relevant, and technical pathway content will be available to all students on a sign-up basis but will not be mandatory within the module. Production schedules and techniques will flex to allow for the above range of forms to be addressed, with specialist supervisors guiding students to assessment
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			based on their choice of form. A decision on whether some narrative films from FIL101 can progress to production will be made at the mid-term review point, though the proposed changes will provide a fresh and exciting set of challenges if narrative crew projects prove to be untenable.
