



# **Travelling from Cornwall Airport Newquay to Penryn Campus:**

Information for Falmouth University students travelling

internationally to Penryn Campus, Penryn, Cornwall, TR10 9FE

Welcome! We are looking forward to seeing you in Cornwall. You may have travelled in the UK before, but just in case you haven't, here is some travel information for getting to the Penryn Campus in Cornwall.

#### **CORNWALL COLLECTION SERVICE**

To help support students travelling from outside the UK we offer free collection services from Cornwall Airport Newquay. For full details and bookings please <u>click here</u>.

If you are unable to use the collection service and need to travel independently to the Penryn Campus here's some helpful information. Please do note that public transport from Cornwall Airport Newquay to the Penryn University Campus is very limited.

## TAXI

A taxi from Cornwall Airport Newquay to the Penryn Campus will take about an hour and cost between £55 and £70. We recommend pre-booking if you are considering catching a taxi as hire on the day can be more expensive. Click here for a list of Taxi Companies offering Airport Transfers.

# COACH

Transport for Cornwall operate the number 90 bus which travels from Cornwall Airport Newquay to Truro Bus Station daily. The journey takes about 50 minutes and tickets can be purchase on the bus or from the website. Once at Truro Bus Station you catch the U1 bus operated by First Bus Services which takes about 20 minutes direct to the Penryn Campus Bus Stops.

#### **Top Tips for Travellers**

#### Plan Ahead

Travelling to Cornwall is a long journey. It will take several hours (45mins to 1.5 hours on average) to reach the Penryn Campus from your UK point of entry, so plan ahead (and bring a good book!). Plan and book each stage of your journey to the Penryn Campus before travelling. Tickets on the day in the UK can be much more expensive than buying in advance. Booking ahead also guarantees availability. Buy food and drink before you travel, larger airports and stations have good food choices, but there may not be any food outlets open on board or when you arrive. Carry a refillable water bottle, UK mains tap water is safe to drink.

#### **Travel Light**

Only carry the necessities for your journey and first few days on arrival. Limit luggage to what you can carry and move around by yourself. You can send luggage direct to campus, to arrive after you move in (note the University will not accept advance freight of your luggage and cannot store shipped luggage for you in advance of your arrival). You can also order starter packs, such as bedding and kitchen equipment, from Uni Kit Out, and they'll be sent to your residence in time for your arrival.

### **Keep in Touch**

Carry a UK enabled mobile phone and UK power adapter (many airports, stations, trains and coaches offer free charging points) or spare battery pack. Have the full UK address (including post code) for your accommodation in Cornwall.
