Welcome to BA(Hons) Popular Music at Falmouth.

We're getting in touch with some important information about your course that will help you as you prepare to join us.

At the end of this letter, you will find a list of equipment that you should bring with you, as well as any other costs that you might incur throughout your course.

Your academic experience will be predominantly in person with some courses using a small amount of digital resources to support your learning. To engage in the digital learning activity, although you will be able to access IT suites on campus, you will benefit from a laptop to access the platforms and tools we use. You will be provided with free access to the Microsoft Office suite, (including Word, Excel and PowerPoint) while you study at Falmouth.

If you are eligible for a loan from Student Finance and have not yet applied, please do so immediately to ensure the loan is approved before you enrol. Once you enrol you are liable for the tuition fees. Arriving at Falmouth will be the beginning of a journey that will last for three years and during your time here you and your music will change, grow, and develop. You'll be learning new ways of thinking about popular music as part of culture and as part of an exciting creative industry.

You'll be expanding on how you make music, as well as acquiring skills in all areas of your music practice. There will be opportunities to collaborate and work individually, to record and produce and perform in the studios and in the local venues that make up Falmouth's vibrant arts and music scene.

Later on in your degree, you'll be considering options and what you want to specialise in, and this may involve projects around songwriting, touring, performance, management, education, production, post-graduate research and so on.

Whatever you eventually decide to focus on and however your artistic identity develops, my advice at this stage is to relish every moment from start to finish, because this is an amazing moment in your life and full of potential. There will of course be challenges and at first, at least, it might be slightly disorientating. However, give yourself time to settle and get to know one another. It won't be long before you feel more confident.

Over the summer, you can join our Step into Falmouth Sessions. These online workshops are designed to provide advice and guidance on settling into university life. They are scheduled to

take place across three weeks in July and August. Some of them will also be also recorded so you can watch them back at a time that suits you. More information can be found at falmouth.ac.uk/experience/new-students/step-into-falmouth

Over the summer, if you have any questions, you can join the Student Mentor team on Discord to talk about the course, living in Cornwall and what to expect at Falmouth. Enrolment and Student Terms & Conditions

You'll get an email two weeks before the start of term telling you how to enrol online. You'll need to enrol before the first day of term to officially register as a student of Falmouth University and receive your undergraduate student loan.

When you enrol, you'll need to agree to and comply with the University's Student Terms & Conditions. These Terms & Conditions are important, and we encourage you to read them carefully, before enrolling. Teaching and assessment will be throughout the full 15 weeks of the study blocks.

Your timetable

Your academic timetable shows all scheduled learning activities and your course timetable. It will be published in early September. After you've enrolled, you can view it via the Student Portal at falmouth.myday.cloud/ or the Falmouth University App. You can download the app by searching the Google Play Store or Apple Store.

Welcome Week

Your timetable will show you where you need to go and when on Monday 18 September and throughout the week.

This is the week when you'll meet your course mates, course tutors and University staff. There will be important inductions to both your course and the wider University facilities and services, in addition to social activities organised by the University and Students' Union.

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Equipment and costs

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Instruments

All our practice studios are equipped with a piano and/or keyboard, amplifiers (including vocal PA) and a drum kit. Drummers should bring their own sticks, cymbals, and snare. Other instrumentalists must bring their own instrument with them, and budget for any expendables relating to your specific instrument such as strings, plectrums and leads.

The AMATA recording studios have Mac computers equipped with a range of the major DAWs for audio production work. In addition, you will be able to use our mobile Mac laptop station with a range of professional audio and video software as well as a dedicated Mac Pro room.

However, a personal Mac or PC laptop capable of running professional DAW software (Ableton Live, Pro Tools, Reaper, Logic, FL Studio, Cubase etc) will be an essential piece of equipment. You will be provided with access to Ableton Live Suite in your first year, but you can use alternative software if you wish.

Backups

It is of paramount importance to keep copies of all your digital files. We recommend using two physical back-up drives with a large capacity and fast transfer speeds as well as the cloud storage available to you on OneDrive via Microsoft Office.

Headphones

You can book headphones from AMATA's Technical Resource Stores, however a pair of good quality, open-back headphones are recommended for regular studio and production work. Prices vary but expect to pay upwards of £80-£100. If you are not sure what you need, search the Internet for 'studio monitor headphone review'.

Notetaking

You may wish to use your laptop for notetaking. However, if you prefer pen and paper, then we would suggest spending around £10 on pens and notepads / journals.

Ear protection

Your ears are the most important pieces of audio kit you will ever own! Looking after them is therefore top priority. Dispensers with free disposable foam earplugs are situated outside the practice and performance studios throughout the AMATA building, but it is also recommended that you purchase high quality earplugs - especially if you play in a loud group or attend gigs and/or clubs.
