

Student Code of Conduct

This document sets out the behaviour expected of Falmouth University students, supporting a respectful, inclusive and safe learning environment.

1 Scope

1.1 The Code applies to all students and their behaviour:

- on campus and student accommodation
- online, including on social media
- in the wider University and local community
- during placements, fieldwork or other University-related external activities

2 Purpose

2.1 We are committed to creating and fostering a positive environment in which all students engage responsibly with their studies, the University and the wider community, and treat others with respect, dignity and care. Everyone plays a part in making Falmouth a positive place to learn, create and live, and this code outlines what we expect of you.

3 Expectations

3.1 **Respect:**

- treat others with dignity and respect,
- support diversity and different perspectives
- don't tolerate harassment, bullying, intimidation or discrimination

3.2 **Responsibility:**

- follow University regulations, policies, procedures and guidance
- behave appropriately and professionally
- take responsibility for your actions
- think and act sustainably

3.3 **Integrity:**

- produce your own work
- acknowledge your sources properly
- be ethical in your practice

3.4 **Health and safety:**

- follow health and safety guidance
- don't put yourself or others at risk

3.5 **Freedom of speech:**

- be creative and share ideas
- listen to the opinions of others
- debate openly but respectfully and within the law
