

IOP SCHOOLS PROJECT REPORT 2024

A COLLABORATIVE PROJECT BETWEEN THE INSTITUTE OF PHOTOGRAPHY AND REDRUTH SCHOOL.

CONTEXT

During the 2023-24 academic year, the IOP worked with GCSE students at Redruth School. The project included Falmouth students running story development and editing workshops at Redruth school with the GCSE students as well as an all-day newsroom in the IOP digi suite.

KEY FINDINGS

- 9 students completed the evaluation form, 12 offered data.
- The overall percentage of recipients living in a POLAR4 Q1 or Q2 area was 67%
- The overall percentage of recipients meeting one or more indicator of deprivation was 100%
- 89% students said they agreed or strongly agreed they knew a lot about university following the project
- 100% students said they were considering university following the project, with 56% considering Falmouth.
- 100% students felt they had learnt a new skill and 44% would consider studying photography in the future.
